## The Authors

**John Barrow** <a href="www.damtp.cam.ac.uk/people/j.d.barrow/">www.damtp.cam.ac.uk/people/j.d.barrow/</a> is a Research Professor in the Department of Applied Mathematics and Theoretical Physics in the University of Cambridge, and Director of the Millennium Mathematics Project <a href="www.mmp.maths.org">www.mmp.maths.org</a>. A cosmologist with more than 400 publications, he has also written extensively on popular science. He will talk on his most recent book <a href="#page-100.25sential-Things-You Didn't Know-You Didn't Know-About Maths and the Arts">100 Essential Things You Didn't Know-About Maths and the Arts</a>.

**Spike Bucklow** <a href="http://people.ds.cam.ac.uk/sb10029/">http://people.ds.cam.ac.uk/sb10029/</a> is Senior Research Scientist and Teacher of Theory at the Hamilton Kerr Institute, the Fitzwilliam Museum. Originally trained as a chemist, in the 1980s he made special effects for block-buster movies. Over the last ten years his in-depth examination of great thirteenth and fourteenth century paintings has resulted in ground-breaking research into the science and craft of the medieval artist. He will talk on his book *The Riddle of the Image*.

**Graham Farmelo** grahamfarmelo.com/ is a biographer and science writer, a By-Fellow at Churchill College, and an Adjunct Professor of Physics at Northeastern University, Boston. Author of *The Strangest Man*, a prize-winning biography of the theoretical physicist Paul Dirac, he will talk on his most recent book, *Churchill's Bomb*.

Jerry Toner <a href="classics.cam.ac.uk/directory/jerry-toner/">classics.cam.ac.uk/directory/jerry-toner/</a> is a Fellow at Churchill College and an Affiliated Lecturer in Classics. He returned to Cambridge after 10 years as a Fund Manager in the City of London, managing \$15Bn in global bond, currency and asset allocation funds. His research looks at Roman social and cultural history, with a focus on trying to look at history 'from below'. He will talk on <a href="How to Manage Your Slaves">How to Manage Your Slaves</a>, a guide drawing on the extensive experience of his 'co-author' Marcus Sidonius Falx, a Roman of Noble Birth.
