The Three Wise Men An up-to-date look at the Past

The Wolfson Lecture Theatre, Churchill College, Storey's Way, Cambridge

About the topic:

The story of the Three Wise Men from the East is found only in St Matthew's Gospel. It has intrigued scholars for many centuries. Churchmen and theologians have debated whether the passage might just be a later addition intended to prove that the Nativity was relevant to the whole world and not just the Jewish nation. Astronomers likewise have puzzled over the Bible description of the Star of Bethlehem. The speaker is convinced that these accounts are founded on actual events. Based on historical research and modern computer software capable of re-creating the exact appearance of the ancient skies, the lecture provides an explanation that fits very closely the Biblical account.

About the Speaker:

Air Vice-Marshal M J D Brown MA CEng CMath CSci FRAes FRIN FIMA.

Mike Brown is a retired Air Vice-Marshal of the Royal Air Force, which he joined in 1953 and was sent to read Mechanical Sciences here at Trinity Hall. Postgraduate education included courses at the RAF Technical and Staff Colleges, the USAF Air War College, and the Royal College of Defence Studies. He qualified as an RAF pilot in 1959, and has had extensive experience of communications, radar, navigation, guided weapons, and space systems. Before retiring from the RAF in 1991 his final appointments were as Director of Air Weapons and Director General of Strategic Electronic Systems. He has assisted in residential course in the design of safety critical computer systems each year since 1992 and is currently a Council Member of the Royal Institute of Navigation. He is active in voluntary welfare casework for ex-Services charities and as Chairman of the Peterborough Astronomical, Art, and Cambridge Societies.
